Here he shares three of his favorite places for Thai, sushi and pasta.

Which restaurants do you turn to when you're not working?

I like Chada Thai & Wine for Thai food, Sushi Fever on West Sahara for sushi and Siena Deli on West Sahara for fresh pasta and great Italian deli food.

What dishes are most memorable?

Siena Deli serves super cavatelli pasta with spicy Italian Sausage. At Sushi Fever, I'd say the "Dale Earnhart Roll" with soft shell crab and "Kiss of Fire" with jalapeños stand out most.

Why do you enjoy going there?

The common theme for me is consistent quality food, good service, fair pricing and they are all close to my home for convenience.
